PURPOSE AND GOALS OF THE SUMMIT



KEYNOTE SPEAKER: *Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye was sworn in as the 28th Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court on January 3, 2011. Chief Justice Cantil-Sakauye has more than 20 years of service in the appellate and trial courts and, as the leader of the judicial branch in California, has been innovative in achieving greater transparency, efficiency, and equal access to justice. Chief Justice Cantil-Sakauye is dedicated to juvenile justice issues and has launched the California Keeping Kids in School and Out of the Court Initiative, as well as the Power of Democracy promoting partnerships of state and local organizations focusing on civics literacy and positive educational outcomes for youth.*

The summit will also provide interactive opportunities to identify and explore gaps in current services and programming and candidly discuss “next step” resolutions to those issues.
