

# Orange County's First Year-Round Homeless Shelter and Service Center



*Part of Orange County's System of Care*

Located at 1000 N Kraemer Place in the City of Anaheim, this transitional facility will ultimately provide year-round shelter and services to 200 individuals every night, who are experiencing homelessness.

## PROJECT BACKGROUND

- › Envisioned by the County Board of Supervisors in 2013
- › Designed with the support of north county cities including: Anaheim, Fullerton, Orange, Placentia, Brea, Buena Park, La Palma, La Habra, and Yorba Linda.
- › Endorsed by community partners and stakeholders including local faith-based groups
- › Broke ground in 2016

## GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY

- › Bed reservation system
- › No walk-up participants
- › North County preference
- › Screening prior to entry
- › On-site security
- › Experienced shelter operator
- › Neighborhood patrol
- › Community Oversight – Community Advisory Board

## PHASE ONE - MAY 2017

- › 100 beds (single men & women)
- › 6,000 square feet
- › Onsite centralized intake, assessment and crisis evaluation
- › Dining hall (co-located with living area) with meals delivered
- › Restrooms & showers (modular)
- › Laundry
- › Transportation services & assistance
- › Access to day-time service providers and job referrals
- › Case management/employment and housing navigation

## PHASE TWO - SUMMER 2018

- › 200 beds total (single men & women)
- › 24,000 square feet
- › Complete multi-service center
- › On-site services
- › Interior bathrooms and showers
- › Warming kitchen
- › Computer lab
- › Employment training
- › Health Clinic
